### WHITE WATER RAFTING

Flowing south from Mt. Adams to the Columbia River Gorge, the White Salmon River is a two-hour adrenaline rush through a picturesque canyon. More than a leisurely float, it's an exhilarating progression of class two, three, and four rapids, interspersed with quiet pools and delicate waterfalls.

When most Pacific Northwest white water rivers are reduced to a late summer trickle, the spring-fed White Salmon River maintains a healthy base flow for year round rafting. Even in the summer, the trip comes complete with a cool soaking!

The White Salmon is more than a white water rafting river, it's an experience of nature's beauty. Be prepared for a visual treat of lush vegetation, steep canyon walls, wildlife and clear rushing waters.

### COLUMBIA RIVER GORGE/BONNEVILLE DAM/ HOOD RIVER

**Tour departs Oregon Convention Center**

Load the buses and head east to the town of Troutdale. This is a quaint little town with lots of antique stores that we drive right through on our way to the historic highway. We will follow this highway to the Multnomah Falls and Lodge. Along the way, we will stop just long enough to take pictures at the Vista House, which sits 733 feet above the Columbia River. Your first glimpse of the Columbia River Gorge area will take your breath away. The road passes flowers, trees, many waterfalls, and basaltic rock that is six or seven million years old. As we arrive, you can view the Multnomah Falls, which at 620 feet, is the second highest year-round waterfall in the nation.

From Multnomah Falls, we will jump back on the freeway and head into the little town of Hood River. This small town has become the wind-sailing hot spot for the world. If the wind is good, we'll catch sight of many people sailing. We will stop at the Apple Valley Store, where we'll get dessert to go with our box lunches. Homemade apple crisp, ice cream, and coffee or tea. Enjoy this store with food samples out-for-the-tasting.

Board the buses and head back toward Portland. We will stop at the Bonneville Dam, a national historic landmark. Construction began in 1933, and the lock and dam was dedicated by President Franklin D. Roosevelt on September 28, 1937. This plant takes more than 100 people to operate and maintain. The visitors center is filled with the history of the dam and offers a view of the fish ladders -- each fish actually counted! After we finish, we will board the bus and return to Portland.

In addition, the early history of the Chinese, Japanese, and Gypsies will be covered. The tour is operated by the Cascade Geographic Society (CGS) and provides a unique glimpse back into the hidden (or buried) past of the "City of Roses."

## **CITY TOUR/PITTOCK MANSION/ROSE GARDEN**

### **Tour departs Oregon Convention Center**

Start this tour from the Oregon Convention Center, traveling over the Steel Bridge (one of 17 that cross the Willamette River) by going up to Broadway., Continue on Broadway and take a little spin around Pioneer Courthouse Square, considered Portland's Living Room. You will see many interesting things, from mileage signs to Russia to a wonderful weather vane. From the square, go back up 3rd street and pass in front of the Fourcourt Fountain, where 13,000 gallons of water cascade, then head to Naito Parkway. Follow Naito Parkway along Tom McCall Waterfront Park and your first sight, besides the river, will be Mills End Park, the world's smallest dedicated park-24 inches and only one visitor at a time, please. We will view the dancing waters of the Salmon Street Springs Fountain, see the Blue Back Submarine parked at OMSI, and view the Japanese American Historical Plaza Bill of Rights Memorial.

We will see China Town/Old Town and then ,like taking a giant step, we will view the Pearl District, home to up-scale galleries, restaurants, and specialty shops on every corner. We will drive through Nob Hill, one of the first settled areas of Portland, with its historic houses and quaint shops, restaurants, antique and vintage stores. Then, on to the Pittock Mansion, a fully furnished, magnificent turn-of-the-century, architectural treasure built between 1914 and 1919. The mansion also offers a sweeping view of the surrounding Cascade Mountains and the city of Portland.

After our tour, what better way to end the day than to walk through the International Rose Test Gardens and smell the perfume of over 8,000 roses of every color of the rainbow? This is the oldest official, continuously-operated public rose garden in the United States.

## **MT HOOD RAILROAD TRIP**

Travel east on the freeway, to the town of Hood River and the world's best wind sailing, which you may be able to view as we travel toward our destination, the Mt. Hood Railroad.

Step aboard a century-old train, dating from the 1900s, for a four-hour ride. The train has enclosed Pullman coaches, a concession car (offering light food & beverage), a red caboose, and an open air car. Sit back and enjoy the view as the train travels along the river, through forests, meadows, and fruit orchards to the town of Parkdale at the foot of Mt. Hood. Live narration along the way covers local history and key points of interest.

There is a one-hour layover in Parkdale where you can enjoy lunch in the park and browse the gift shops. Then re-board for the ride back to Hood River.

## **LEWIS & CLARK HISTORICAL TOUR**

We begin this tour by traveling through the Willamette Valley and over the Coast Mountain Range. Our first stop will be Ecola State Park for fantastic views of the coast. This is the area that Clark visited with Sacagawea to look for a beached whale. We will next travel Lewis and Clark's route up the Oregon Coast to Astoria. Once in Astoria, we'll see great views of the surrounding mouth of the Columbia River from above at the Astor Column before lunch in downtown Astoria (on your own). After lunch we will visit the Historic Fort Clatsop where Lewis and Clark spent the winter of 1805-1806. Ft. Clatsop is America's newest National Park. On our return trip we will follow Lewis & Clark's route up the mighty Columbia River, crossing into Washington State for a brief period before arriving back in Portland.
