CITY TOUR/PITTOCK MANSION/ROSE GARDEN

THURSDAY, JULY 13

Tour departs Double Tree Hotel

Start this tour from the Oregon Convention Center, travel over the Steel Bridge (one of 17 that cross the Willamette River) by going up to Broadway, continue up on Broadway and take a little spin around Pioneer Courthouse Square, considered Portland's Living Room. You will see many interesting things: from mileage signs to Russia to a wonderful weather vane. From the square, go back up 3rd Street and pass in front of the Fourcourt Fountain, where 13,000 gallons of water cascade. Then head to Naito Parkway. Follow Naito Parkway down along Tom McCall Waterfront Park and your first sight, besides the river, will be Mills End Park, the world's smallest dedicated park-24 inches and only one visitor at a time, please! We will view the dancing waters of the Salmon Street Springs Fountain, the Blue Back Submarine parked at OMSI, and view the Japanese American Historical Plaza Bill of Rights Memorial.

We will view China Town/Old Town and then, like taking a giant step, we will view the Pearl District, home to up-scale galleries, restaurants

and specialty shops on every corner. We will drive through Nob Hill, one of the first settled areas of Portland with its historic houses and quaint shops, restaurants, and antiques and vintage stores. We will proceed to the Pittock Mansion, a fully furnished, magnificent turn-of-the century, architectural treasure built between 1914 and 1919. The mansion offers a sweeping view of the surrounding Cascade Mountains and the city of Portland.

What better way to end the day than to walk through the International Rose Test Gardens and smell the perfume of over 8,000 roses of every color of the rainbow? This is the oldest official, continuously-operated public rose garden in the United States.
