Submission of Abstracts

For consideration as a presenter, your 150-word typed abstract must be submitted online between Wed., Jul. 8, 2009 and Fri, Nov 6, 2009. **ASABE and IA reserve the right to limit submissions to one paper; acceptance is not guaranteed.**

Your abstract must include concise descriptive content that explains the value of the information. Papers/presentations must be non-proprietary and educational in nature, not sales or product specific. They may include research, programs and case studies. You must also present your paper in SI units; translators are not permitted.

Abstracts must be submitted online no later than Nov 6, 2009.

Presenters will be selected and notified by the end of December 2009. Upon acceptance, each speaker will be required to submit a \$250 publishing fee, as well as a complete written paper, by **April 1, 2010**. The papers will be reviewed for format and returned to the authors. A revised paper for inclusion in the published CD-ROM proceedings will be required by **Oct 1, 2010**.

As a benefit of presenting, you will receive a complimentary full registration to the show, which includes access to the exhibits, innovations in irrigation conference, keynote and general session, and a copy of the conference proceedings CD. Travel and hotel expenses will be your responsibility.
